Aeolus gave HRSC a sun blessed Mediterranean day for its dinghy Regatta, but nothing comes from the gods free, and so it was with a wind that blew ESE to WNW and from 1-12kts. Helford's fleet was swelled to near 30 sailors with the arrival from St Mawes SC of Mike Croft's and Benny Hallam's youth Laser 4.7 and Feva Fleets for 3 good races. On the committee boat, Bold Lancer, Race Officer Tom Smith and Steve Kestin set a southerly course 180 degrees opposite the WNW forecast. Amy Boyle & her Crew Matthew Hill dominated Feva XL and Laser 4.7 fleets with an orderly 3,2,1 to take Gold Overall and Gold in her Class. Henry Hallam & Ashley Hill completed a similar task with a 1,5,2 to take 2,2 overall and in the Feva's. Ollie Croft with a 2,3,3 took 1st in the 4.7's and with 8 good points equalled the Hallam Feva's tally – and so came 3rd overall – by sailings unique accounting. Joe Pothecary – the oldest man in the St Mawes fleet at 16 took 2nd in the 4.7's with an erratic 6,1,9 – a whisker ahead of Ben Harvey. In the 17-18 section Beks Hosking was the First HRSC 4.7 boat home followed by a chipper Ed Hosken. Jack Lawrence and Fin Walsh-Newton gave a plucky performance in their Feva.

In the PY fleet & Laser Open, Roger McDonald had his own race from Restronguet to the mouth of the Helford and back - 5 hours of toil which deserved a medal for effort. Chris Hosken's chivalrous & handsome performance gave way to Great Grand Master Dave Philpott's Solo – racing in his 81^{st} year. Beccy Kestin was consoled with Lady Helm prize and 3^{rd} in the Laser Open; equipment failure in the third race robbed her of 1^{st} . Stephen Brooks performed the only capsize of the day but was delighted to beat his arch rival Andrew Hosking taking 2^{nd} in the Laser Open. From La Rochelle – Hugo Helene, delighted in taking third overall and 1^{st} in the Laser Open. Ollie Berryman & Ed Bolitho on their last race ever in their RS400 zoomed around in fine style but were defeated by an elegant dry bathtub – the N12 driven with panache by Andy Biggs and Karen Hemsley-Biggs for first.
