The Club has made significant progress with our new CRM database software. You can place information about yourself, your boat, your relationships with family etc. and also see the Club membership, calendar, duty rosters etc. We will draft up a complete procedure and post this on the HRSC website. In the future, we hope to make access to your individual records through the HRSC website. Please help us to get this project fully underway. 

WAYFARERS IN 2016

As a new season inexorably approaches the pulse quickens, the eyesight becomes somehow sharper and the distant autumnal smells of rotting leaves become past memories. There are some of us in the Club whose Tuesday evening delight is to take a Club Wayfarer out onto one of the most delightful stretches of coastline in the South West, which is our very own Helford River.

Unfortunately, before that can happen the ageing fleet of Wayfarers has to be brought up to scratch and the numerous problems which are a legacy of the previous season, and in some cases, (seasons) before, have to be remedied. All of this requires the co-operation of the Tuesday night group of stalwarts who, for reasons best known to themselves, are more than willing to help maintain these ageing craft, especially if beer is involved!

The operational maintenance plan will have been carefully crafted over the winter season when, instead of spending time out on the freezing water on a Tuesday night, the bar sailing programme plays a pivotal and essential part of the Wayfarer maintenance planning programme.

For those of you Club Members who may not be aware of the Tuesday evening sailing programme with the Wayfarer fleet, you should know that regular Members provide a means to get intimately acquainted with the Helford River at a slightly less frenetic pace than might otherwise be the case with the racing component within the Club. The joy of having a Club which entertains a diversity of interest is to be much admired in my opinion. Catering for everybody's needs is difficult however; for those of us whose racing days and interests are dwindling into old age and obscurity, the gentle art of Wayfarer sailing fulfils our, and maybe your, need to the very letter?

The majority of the "Tuesday nighters" have reasonably extensive experience of various types of craft and, as a result, can provide a pathway to learn sailing skills or to regain forgotten ones. We accommodate all ages and over the years have catered for the young, old, and even those with learning difficulties with a degree of success commensurate with the enthusiasm that is bought to the evening. During the season we usually enjoy a barbecue which is always well patronised and our post sailing analysis of the evening's events at the bar afterwards can be interesting if not revealing.

So, if you fancy trying something new, or old, just remember that we assemble after $1730 \, \text{hrs}$ and are usually out on the water by $1830 \, \text{hrs}$. We aim to be back on the moorings by $2000 - 2030 \, \text{hrs}$. Please let us know in advance if you will be joining us so we can plan to allocate you a seat in a boat as sometimes it can become quite cosy out there on the water if we get too many people. Life jackets are essential and warm clothing will be needed in the early and latter part of the season. We try to accommodate all concerned ...depending on the tides.

YACHT RACING AND CRUISING

We had a very useful yacht wash-up meeting recently at which we discussed the current interest in racing and cruising among Club Members. The minutes of the meeting are on the Club website (www.helfordriversc.co.uk) in the Yachts section.

I am sure that many of us are aware that the level of participation in yacht racing has declined significantly over the last couple of years. No doubt there are a number of reasons for this and you will see from the meeting minutes that we have agreed various actions to address matters.

One of the things that the meeting thought might be putting off potential yacht racers from joining in was cost so I have put together a short list of our 707 costs for last year.

They were as follows:-

Mooring- £650, Insurance - £193, Crane in out and trailer storage - £426, Winter storage - £300, General maintenance and antifouling - £290, Total £1859. Obviously some of these costs could be reduced by self-launching, recovery and storage. Boats are currently available for around £5,000 so shared amongst a syndicate this represents very affordable racing.

However the most important thing that we on the Committee must do to encourage participation is to find out from Members what we all want with regard to racing and cruising and then to try to address these requirements.

Therefore if you are at all interested in participating in any sort of racing, or any sort of cruising events, and have any suggestions which we could put into practice which would encourage your participation, do please let us know what they might be.
